## FROM THE PASTOR

*"There are two kinds of people: those who say to God, 'Thy will be done,'  
and those to whom God says, 'All right, then, have it your way.'"*

*CS Lewis*

I like CS Lewis a lot; he was a professor at Cambridge University, and a Roman Catholic theologian, who wrote The Chronicles of Narnia and The Screwtape Letters, among other things. He has a terrific understanding of the human psyche; he knew how stubborn we can be. He also had a terrific understanding of God's love, and God's willingness to allow us to make bad choices, because God has given humans free will.

The choices we make matter. God allows us the freedom to make choices that can lead to horrible consequences. In that mysterious intersection between free will and the sovereignty of God, our willingness to listen to God's guidance, or our willfulness to do what we want to do - that decision point - it matters. If we are honest with ourselves, we usually know when we are making bad choices, and we always we know when we are not following God's guidance. The choices we make between saying "Thy will be done," or God saying, "All right, then, have it your way," influences our destiny. God will always work out God's purposes. Always. But we can make things infinitely complex by what we choose to do and what we choose not to do. We don't get to see what would have been if we had chosen differently; we only get to see what grows out of the choices we make.

So what is God asking us to do? What is God asking us to do as individuals, as small groups within the church, as the particular congregation that is known as the Readington Reformed Church, as the particular denomination that is known as the Reformed Church in America? What is God's will for us?

Scripture is a good place to start. What was the point of the law? What did the prophets talk about? What does the history described in the bible tell us, about God and about God's will for humanity? There is instruction about caring for the weak, the orphans, the aliens among us. There is concern for the poor and those without a lot of power. There is concern about focusing on the living God, and being mindful of serving only Him. Jesus spoke of the same things, while emphasizing relationship - relationship between His followers, and their relationship with the Lord their God.

February is a month where we talk a lot about love. This month, as we think about love, may we also think about God's love for us, and our love for God. God's love took concrete form when the Word became flesh and came to dwell among us. It is a love that was acted out in ministries of healing, of feeding the hungry, of casting out demons and of speaking out against injustice while calling us all into relationship with God, especially through His Son. It is a love that redeemed us, a love that offers salvation to those who will accept it, through grace. It is a love that still calls on us to ask, "What is Thine will?" It is a love that still gives us the freedom to insist on our own way, a love that will yield, saying, "All right, then, have it your way." May we have the wisdom to ask, "Father, what do You want me to do?" and then may we do it, serving Him who loves us best, until Jesus comes again. And even so, come soon, Lord Jesus!

## COMMITTEE & ORGANIZATION NEWS

### CONSISTORY CORNER

- Bob Cole has agreed to serve as the new clerk of consistory.
- Marvin Fields was elected as the vice president of consistory.
- The year-end financial report is good; the weekly envelope giving came in well above the estimate of weekly giving, and we are finishing the year in the black.
- The finance committee is establishing a separate fund for funds dedicated to the repair/replacement of the steeple. Funds from the proceeds of the turkey dinner and funds donated for that specific purpose will be transferred there soon. Our cash flow situation is good.
- Marvin Fields has met with member-at-large Tom Barnes to consider his possible call to fill the unexpired term of Brenda Gerlipp, who resigned from the consistory in December. Tom is in a period of prayer and discernment; he will meet again with Marvin and then the elders will meet to consider the situation.
- Imre Vitez has been elected as the chair of the deacons. Toni Rathborne will mentor new deacon Sarah VandeGiessen, and Imre Vitez will mentor new deacon Eric Stettner. The deacons presented a slate of Missions of the Month to the consistory, which was approved. For specifics see the separate newsletter article for the February mission of the month, or contact the deacons.
- The consistory retreat will be held at South Branch Reformed on Jan. 21 (6-9PM) and Jan. 22 (8-3). Topics they will be reviewing, in order of ranking from highest to least are: outreach; ending the consistory meetings by 10 PM; the deacons; fundraising and a fundraising chair; the web page (1 respondent); music care committee; a personnel committee; establishment of a "pew buddy" system.
- The consistory approved the use of the building on March 26 for a blood drive organized by the Girl Scouts.
- 2010 Yearbook reports are due by Jan. 31. The target distribution date for the yearbook is 2/15.
- The consistory asks that people review the e-mail addresses listed in the church directory and make any needed updates with Terry so the directory can also be published by 2/15.

- The following committee chairs and/or liaisons for 2011 are: Finance - Wendi Kalley and/or Dave Cole, as liaison (chair to be determined at next meeting); IT Committee - Jim Kennedy, chair; Bob Lefever, liaison; Memorials & Student Loans - Dave Cole as liaison; verification pending that Patrice Chadwick will continue as chair; Endowment - Members: Bob Cole, Wendi Kalley, Wilma Matysek, Dick Weger, Herb Wood, Pastor Cathy; Pastor Cathy to convene a meeting in the near future; Spiritual Care - Carol Gauer as liaison; Karen Weber as chair; Building & Grounds and Cemetery, Imre Vitez as liaison, Ken Iselin as chair; Fellowship/Outreach/FunRaising - Toni Rathborne at least as liaison
- The consistory has accepted Pat Ciccotelli's resignation from chairing the dinner fundraisers with regret and with gratitude for her hard devoted work over the years.
- The consistory is considering folding the work of the three dinners we do into the prevue of fundraising committee, having the committee itself function as the chair. This will be discussed at the retreat.
- The Consistorial Covenant was read and signed, and will be posted in Fellowship Hall soon.
- The consistory is considering not renewing our bulk-mailing contract, now that most distribution of the newsletter is done via e-mail. Herb Wood (retired postmaster of the Neshanic Station PO) will work with Terry to investigate the ramifications of this.
- Starting with the February 2011 newsletter, the primary way of circulating it will be via e-mail.
- The great consistory will be asked to help when needed to assist in serving communion and for helping as assistant counters. Several members of consistory are head counters or sign checks and therefore cannot count. This is a place where the great consistory can be extremely helpful.
- The organ is on its last legs; at the retreat the consistory will discuss how to prioritize the replacement of the organ, considering the list of other priorities we also have.
- Pastor Cathy presented preliminary feedback from meeting with the Readington Department of Social Services (Diane Clapp and her assistant, Bonnie Liddane) and with Police Chief Donaruma. Pastor Cathy outlined some ideas on how we might be able to address some needs they expressed as a possible outreach effort to both the groups who use the building and to the wider community. This will be discussed in more depth at the retreat.

## DENOMINATIONAL ASSESSMENT

The 2011 assessment per active member is \$83.08. This breaks down to \$44.00 for General Synod, \$32.75 for Regional Synod of Mid-Atlantic, and \$6.33 to the Classis of Delaware-Raritan. The total amount owed by the Readington Reformed Church for 2011 is \$6,563.32.

This assessment amount of \$6,563.32 is an additional cost required by Classis and is an additional cost above our normal operating costs of RRC. You will find two Assessment Envelopes in your box which should be used for this amount. One is for February and one is for October, for anyone who may find it difficult to pay the entire amount at once.

Please be aware that your giving is a personal decision between you and God. The above data is provided so that you can make informed choices according to the way you budget and the way you wish to give.

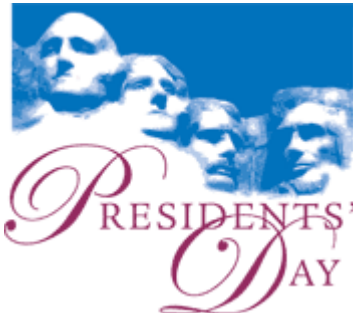
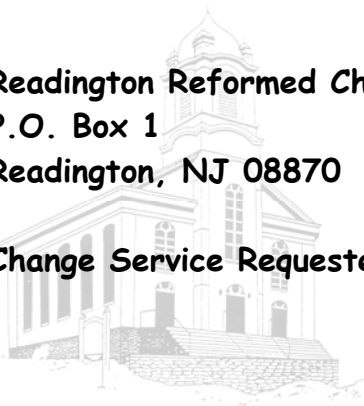
