FROM THE PASTOR

One of the first bits of information we exchange with someone else is our name. Even name tags reflect this reality: "Hello, my name is _____." Knowing what someone's name is gives us a little bit of insight into their identity, into who they are, into their self-understanding.

The title of this year's ecumenical Lenten study is *The Name You Claim*. Since names give clues to our identity, they matter. What kind of names do we claim for ourselves? How do we reveal ourselves to others by the names we take for ourselves?

Especially telling in our identities are the names of groups with whom we align ourselves. For example, my identity is: Christian, female, mother, pastor, teacher, American. Those are all crucial facets of my own identity, the things that make me me, for better or for worse. I can describe them and rank order them because I have had the opportunity to think about them, to play with this list, and to try on and discard a number of identities to help me determine who I really am.

Our behaviors and our identities should reflect one another. That is how we show that we can be trusted. Those things help others know what to anticipate from us, again for better or for worse. They help us to lead authentic lives that become transparent over time, because our words and deeds do match up. It's about practicing what we preach - which is never an easy task.

This is not easy work. None of us are perfectly consistent - and the line for imperfection starts behind me! Yet this is one of the ways we testify to the value of a life grounded in our beliefs.

People observe and compare and contrast our words and our deeds - and when in doubt, they will always believe what we do. That's why non-verbals in communication are so important; they carry a lot of information about our real identities and our sincerity.

People followed Jesus, and still follow Jesus, because His identity - Son of God and Son of Man - were in perfect alignment. As Christians, we too are called to align our words and actions so that our identity: the engrafted children of God, chosen and called by name, glorifies God and serves to draw others into the circle identified as Christian.

May we live into our Christian identities fully and well, doing that which is pleasing to God, doing that which furthers the inbreaking of the kingdom of heaven here on earth, until Jesus returns in glory.

DENOMINATIONAL ASSESSMENT

The numbers for the General Synod and the Regional Synod were incorrect in last month's announcement. Please note the corrected announcement below:

The 2010 assessment per active member is \$81.26. This breaks down to \$41.46 for General Synod, \$32.68 for Regional Synod of Mid-Atlantic, and \$7.12 to the Classis of Delaware-Raritan. The total amount owed by the Readington Reformed Church for 2010 is \$7,150.88.

This assessment amount of \$7,150.88 is an additional cost required by Classis and is an additional cost above our normal operating costs of RRC. You will find two Assessment Envelopes in your box which should be used for this amount. One is for February and one is for October, for anyone who may find it difficult to pay the entire amount at once.

Please be aware that your giving is a personal decision between you and God. The above data is provided so that you can make informed choices according to the way you budget and the way you wish to give.
