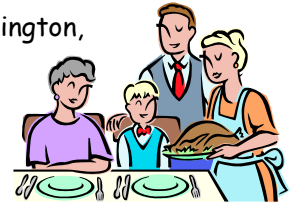
TURKEY DINNER

The following are the basic Three Bean and Macaroni Salad recipes (please, no tuna or salad dressing):

3 BEAN SALAD (please triple recipe)

1 LB. can kidney beans, drained	1 onion (in rings - thin)
1 LB. can wax beans, drained	1/2 cup diced green pepper
1 LB. can green beans, drained	chopped pimento
1/2 cup diced celery	

Dressing (please **DOUBLE** recipe, **DO NOT TRIPLE**)

1 cup sugar	1/2 cup oil
1/4 tsp. pepper	3/4 cup vinegar
1 tsp. salt

MACARONI SALAD (please triple recipe)

1 lb. **uncooked** elbow macaroni 1/3 cup vinegar
1/2 cup shredded carrots 2 cups **mayonnaise**
1/2 cup chopped green or red peppers salt & pepper to taste
1/4 cup finely chopped onion

Cook macaroni according to package directions. Drain well with cold water. Drain again. Place all ingredients in a large bowl and mix gently. Chill. (Please remember, **NO tuna** or **salad dressing.**)

The following recipe for Pineapple Cake should be followed exactly as written. If at all possible, please bake this in a throw-away pan. This will help the dish washing crew and we also won't have to worry about returning pans to the proper owners. Thanks!

PINEAPPLE CAKE*

2 cups flour 1 tsp. vanilla
2 cups sugar 20 oz. can crushed pineapple
2 tsp. baking soda (with juice)
2 eggs



In a large mixing bowl mix above ingredients together and beat well. Pour into greased 9 x 13 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 40-45 minutes. Test for doneness by inserting a tooth pick or knife in a few places. If the tooth pick comes out dry you're good.

Frosting: **DO NOT use canned frosting. Follow recipe below because we want all the cakes to be the same. Please put all of the frosting on the cake. Thank you.**

8 oz. softened cream cheese 1/4 lb. softened butter (NO margarine please)
1 & 3/4 cups confectioner's sugar 1 tsp. vanilla

Beat cream cheese and butter together until well blended. Add vanilla and beat well. Gradually add 1 & 3/4 cups confectioner's sugar and beat well. **Please beat frosting UNTIL very white and fluffy before spreading on cooled cake.**

***Please note - no nuts!**

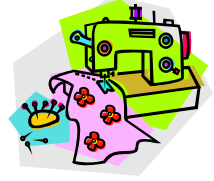

COMMITTEE & ORGANIZATION NEWS

CONSISTORY CORNER

The Readington Reformed Church consistory held a regularly scheduled monthly meeting on April 12, 2011. As part of our meeting devotional, we considered these five points regarding prayer (from *Unbinding the Gospel*):

1. A prayer life has two aspects - individual prayer and prayer with other people.
2. Trusting God for guidance is counter-intuitive.
3. Prayer is a lifelong practice.
4. We need someone to help us learn prayer.
5. We need discernment and accountability.

-The Consistory acknowledged receipt of a generous donation from the Stryker Charitable Fund.

-The church received a verbal offer on a small parcel of property that it owns in Lacey Township, NJ. While no formal offer was made, the consistory recommends no action or sale of property to be made at this time.

-The consistory discussed procedural deposits into the *General Fund* of all contributions including large gifts. A journal is kept to record accrued allocations to various church initiatives/account codes.

-The financial software makes this quite easy. As cash flow allows, money is moved under direction and oversight of treasurer and finance committee.

- The consistory sorted through a list of operational issues developed at our annual retreat and assigned each to a monthly meeting calendar.
- In May, we will be focusing on the issue of Outreach and Church Growth.
- The Information Technology committee has established a Facebook page for the church. Remember to "friend" our page. We will experiment with uploading video recordings of church services.
- The Building and Grounds committee along with the Cemetery committee provided final versions of both a certificate of internment and a certificate of burial.
- The Consistory approved a building usage request for the Gumpert-Jennings wedding for Sunday May 22 at 2 PM.
- Communion will be served on May 1.
- Our next consistory meeting will be held on May 10.

They were established in NYC in 1990 and won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1999. Today 27,000 committed individuals provide aid in nearly 60 countries to people whose survival is threatened by violence, neglect or catastrophe primarily due to armed conflict, natural diseases, lack of health care or malnutrition. They are doctors, nurses, lab techs, logistics experts, mental health experts and epidemiologists. Doctors without Borders brings quality medical care to people caught in crisis regardless of race, religion or political affiliation. 90% of their overall funding comes from private sources not government. 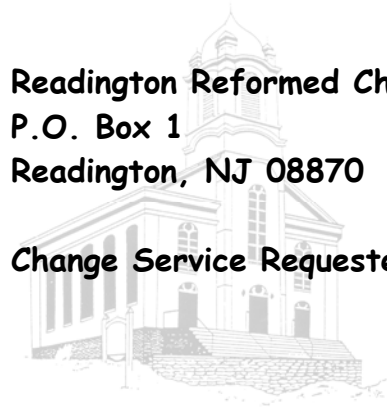
