FROM THE PASTOR

Calendars are funny things. As I type this on a beautiful October morning, with the red shading to burgundy in the leaves of the Bradford pear tree framed by the office window, I am thinking about Advent - because Advent starts as early as it can; this year it begins on November 27. Suddenly I feel a certain reluctant kinship with the stores displaying artificial Christmas trees and ornaments.

During Advent the children (and the rest of us) will be learning about Jesse trees. The scriptural basis for Jesse trees comes from the prophet Isaiah 11: 1-3:

*A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse,
and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding,
the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.
His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.*

Jesse trees were first used around 1100. They focused on the lineage of Jesus, a descendant of Jesse, who was himself the grandson of Ruth and Boaz, and the father of David, the shepherd who became king. In fact, the term "family tree," comes straight from the name "Jesse Tree." Jesse trees were used to teach Christians, most of whom could not read, the linkage between the promises of the Old Testament and the birth of Jesus the Messiah, which of course we celebrate on December 25.

For several hundred years, Jesse trees were painted, carved, or portrayed in stained glass. Eventually people began to decorate tree branches, and even trees, with symbols that reminded them of Jesus' human ancestors, and of the stories told about those ancestors in scripture. Some of those symbols were the ram, which called to mind God's provision of a ram as a redeeming substitute for Abraham offering Isaac. Bears recalled the story of David defeating wild animals while he was a shepherd charged with protecting sheep. Camels recall the journeys the Chosen People made, and the trip of the magi to welcome and worship the One who had been born King of the Jews. The lamb and the wolf refer to the promises in Isaiah of the perfect peace that the Messiah will bring to the world.

Consider the scepter, which reminds us of Mordecai's words to his niece Esther, in the book bearing her name, 4: 13-14: *"Do not think that in the king's palace you will escape any more than all the other Jews. For if you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father's family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this."* Or, as Rich Mullins sings, "Who knows but what you've come into the world for such a time as this?"

Jesus came into the world for such a time as this, the fall and early winter of 2011. As we give thanks for our abundant blessings this month and prepare to greet that wondrous gift of Love, remember, He has called US into the world for such a time as this, too! May we rejoice and serve Him all the days of our lives!

As a result of all of that activity by members and friends of our church, we gained a net income of \$4,700! - and the breakout by category is available from either Bob or Bernie.

On behalf of the Harvest Home Committee, we would like to thank each of you for all of your help! . . . and again to the children who helped throughout the event with a high degree of energy!

COMMITTEE & ORGANIZATION NEWS

CONSISTORY CORNER

The consistory met all day on Saturday October 8th for the purpose of discussing the Steeple Restoration Project.

The consistory was joined by members of the Building and Grounds committee. Together, we met with two contractors. The consistory reviewed full proposals including scope of work, costs, timeframes, and contingencies, etc.. We discussed various design options.

We also discussed the awarded historical grant which would serve as a major source of funding for this project. There were two competing project scopes - one involves building the steeple in place, the other involves installing a pre-fabricated steeple.

We approved an expenditure for professional services related to a structural analysis to verify the integrity of the lower platform supports before proceeding further. The consistory authorized Ken Iselin to hire an engineer that can provide such expertise.

Otherwise, no consistory meeting was held in October.

DEACON OF THE MONTH

We all have experienced a time when we are in need of a little assistance. The Deacons would like to assist you when these times occur. MISSIONS

The Somerset Home for Temporarily Displaced Children is the **Mission of the Month** for **November**. This organization is a nonprofit corporation dedicated to providing a variety of services to youth and young adults at risk of homelessness or maltreatment. Over 500 children, teens, and families are assisted by the 70 Somerset Home staff members each year. Located in Bridgewater, their mission is to provide abused, neglected and homeless youth with housing, a stable environment, and supportive services that guide them in becoming contributing members of society. They sponsor a number of programs, such as Pathways Independent Living Program, where basic life skills required to seek employment, manage monetary earnings, seeking community resources, communicating, and gaining employment are taught. Also available is the Brahma House program, which offers a safe haven, food, clothing, counseling, health care, education and independent-living skills. 24 HOUR PRAYER VIGIL - YOUR PRAYERS ARE NEEDED

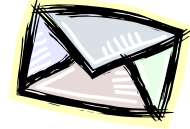

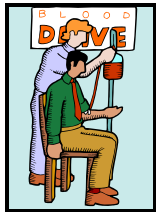

- Hole punch
- Large piece of cardboard or cardstock
- Twine
- Twigs
- Glue
- Acorns, leaves (real or silk) and raffia

What you do:

1. Punch two holes in the top of the cardboard.
2. Thread twine through the holes and tie it in a knot (for hanging).
3. Using twigs, spell out "Be Thankful," "Thank God" or a similar phrase about gratitude. Glue the twigs onto the cardboard.
