FROM THE PASTOR

Many of us know and appreciate a hymn written by George Stebbins in 1890, "Take Time to be Holy." Here's the first verse:

*Take time to be holy, speak oft with thy Lord;
Abide in Him always, And feed on His word.
Make friends of God's children; help those who are weak;
Forgetting in nothing His blessing to seek.*

This is a time of year for reflection, for considering what we are called to do, and how we are called to do it. We will be dedicating our Estimates of Giving at our Consecration Sunday service on October 9. The nominating committee has already begun to prayerfully consider who is called to serve as an elder or as a deacon for the governing body of this church, the consistory. And we are embarking on another series of Unbinding our Hearts, which is intentionally beginning on Consecration Sunday.

Consecration Sunday is about taking the time to consider deliberately what it is God wants us to do with the resources God has given to each of us: our time, our talents and abilities, and our treasures. For us to be able to begin to be transformed into God's holy people, we first need to be transformed by our relationship with God. Christianity is quite specific about this: we are Christians because we affirm - we believe in our hearts and confess with our lips - that Jesus is Lord. We are not "born" Christians; we make deliberate decisions about our beliefs. We baptize infants because the sign of the old covenant, the one God had with the descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, was the sign of circumcision. Infants were circumcised on the eighth day after their birth. The sign of the new covenant is baptism; we baptize infants, just as infants were once circumcised, to show that they are part of God's chosen people and thus in relationship with God. Baptism is a sign and a seal - and still, we also need to believe in our hearts and confess with our lips, things we are not able to do as infants.

Relationships take time and effort, even our relationship with the Lord. If we look at our calendars, at our schedules, at our checking accounts and financial records, I wonder: do those things reflect our beliefs? When we look at data, what does that data say about how we really prioritize our time, our talents and abilities, and our treasures?

The church has some wonderful, exciting projects in the works, and some wonderful things that are nearing completion: the steeple restoration, a new way of doing middle school Sunday School, the dedication of the memorial garden all are being acted on this month. People will be called to serve as elders and deacons. Those things have taken, and will continue to take, our time, our talents and abilities, and our treasures. We need everyone's help to accomplish these tasks God has called us to.

Resolutions don't need to wait until January 1 to be made and acted upon. To the extent that our actions already support our intent to live as Christians, thanks be to God! To the extent that we want to make some adjustments and start again, thanks be to God, and God's graciousness in allowing us do-overs!

COMMITTEE & ORGANIZATION NEWS

CONSISTORY CORNER

The Readington Reformed Consistory met on Tuesday, September 20, 2011.

-Our focus topic remains the Steeple Restoration project. The full consistory is scheduled to meet with two contractors on Saturday, Oct. 8 to discuss qualifications, scope of work, timeframe, cost,

contingencies, etc... We anticipate work to begin in Spring 2012. Depending on several factors the consistory will decide how best to finance the balance of the project. Most of the expense is covered in the form of a grant from Hunterdon County.

-Our Harvest Home/Roast Beef Dinner grossed approximately \$8300. Detailed accounting is taking place in the Harvest Home subcommittee. A tentative date of September 22, 2012 was set for next year's Harvest Home event.

-Please be reminded that a new church photo directory is in the works. All members of the church should schedule a photo session at your earliest convenience.

-The consistory approved the Reformed Church World Service as our mission for all Sunday School offering. This mission serves children all over the world and is directly connected to our annual theme.

-Communion will be served Sunday, October 2 during our regular worship service.

-The Memorial Garden will be dedicated on October 23. This dedication service will begin immediately following our Sunday worship service.

WORSHIP

WORSHIP ASSISTANT/CHILDREN'S SERMON TRAINING

Did you ever wonder how YOU could become a worship assistant, or someone who does children's sermons? It's time to schedule another training session for people who would like to serve in those areas. Worship assistants select the scripture passages for the words of assurance, and the teaching of the law (notifying the church office of their selection by the Wednesday before the service). On Sunday they lead the congregation in the prayer of confession (which the pastor writes, based on the lectionary psalm for that day), and read the passages they have selected for the words of assurance and the teaching of the law. People who do children's sermons have to be comfortable with the possibility of anarchy (as Art Linkletter used to observe, "Kids say the darndest things!"), as they offer a lesson to the children of the congregation, usually (but not always) based on the scriptures for the day.

The training takes approximately an hour. There are handouts to help in preparing to lead these worship responsibilities. This can be a fun, interesting way for YOU to participate in the congregation's worship. Interested? See Pastor Cathy, so she can arrange times for the training.

CHILDREN IN COMMUNION

The sign of the old covenant was and is circumcision; the sign of the new covenant is baptism. Baptism is the first of the two sacraments we celebrate, as Reformed people. The other is communion. Back in the 1980s the denomination's Council on Worship recommended that the table be opened to children who have received whatever instruction the elders of each congregation deemed appropriate. Here at Readington Wilma Matysek and Pastor Cathy developed a curriculum which was approved by the elders in the first half of the decade to teach the children of the congregation about communion, to prepare them to participate in this sacrament.



We will be offering a four week class for children and their parent/guardian to learn about the Reformed perspective on communion starting the first week in October. Participants in this class: are generally at least 8 years old, or older; have been baptized; consistently attend Sunday School; have at least one parent or guardian who is a member of this congregation.

If you are interested in having your child attend, please contact Pastor Cathy, so we can determine which day to hold the class. To sign up, please contact Terry, in the church office (534-2077), Pastor Cathy, or an elder, for a Registration and Covenant Agreement Form.

Marble Brownies

Single Recipe

1 8 oz. package cream cheese
2 1/2 cup sugar
3 eggs
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup margarine (1 stick)
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ squares (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.) unsweetened choc
2 cups flour
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sour cream
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt
1 tsp baking soda
6 oz. package semi-sweet chocolate chips

Double Recipe

(2 8oz packages)
(5 cups)
(6 eggs)
(1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups)
(1 cup/2 sticks)
(3 squares/3 oz)
(4 cups)
(1 cup)
(1 tsp)
(2 tsp)
(12 oz.)

In saucepan, combine margarine and chocolate; melt over low heat, add water. Remove from heat and pour into mixing bowl, add 2 cups sugar and mix well.

In separate mixing bowl, combine softened cream cheese and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar, mix well. Blend in 1 egg and put aside.

In 3rd bowl, add flour, baking soda and salt, mix. Then add to chocolate mixture. Blend in 2 eggs and sour cream.

Pour into greased and floured 10" x 18" x 3" aluminum tray (provided by RRC, Berkley & Jensen low side aluminum tray from Party City)

Spoon cream cheese mixture over chocolate batter. Cut through batter with knife several times in each direction to get marble effect. Sprinkle with chocolate chips.

Bake at 375°F for 30 to 40 minutes until cream cheese just starts to brown. Cool; cut into squares.

NOTE: to make two pans of brownies, simply double ingredients (see totals in parentheses above on right) and split between the two aluminum pans.

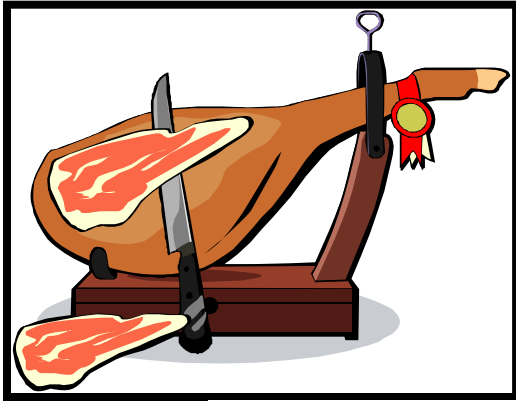
